<p>CHUTZ-POW! Superheroes of the Holocaust is HCP's comic book series. A Classpack consists of 15 or 30 sets of <i>CHUTZ-POW!</i> Vol 1-4, which feature over 20 stories about real life upstanders from the Holocaust. Premium Classpacks include a Teacher's Resource Guide and a Comic-Book Primer, providing instructional language on comic books. <p>The Generations Speakers Bureau is composed of children and grandchildren of Holocaust survivors. Through engaging presentations, our speakers share their family's Holocaust experience. We will try to arrange for a speaker to complement what you're teaching – connecting what students are learning in the classroom to real families' experiences.</p>	<p>While cost will never be a barrier, schools often provide honoraria <u>between \$150-400</u> for a speaker. The program lasts approximately one hour and consists of a 30- to 40-minute presentation followed by a Q&A session (we can work with your time constraints).</p>
<p>Who are Jewish people? What <i>is</i> antisemitism and where does it come from? Why did the Holocaust happen? Our Dismantling Antisemitism Program offers trainings that build capacity for participants to understand what antisemitism is, how it affects Jewish and non-Jewish people, and what we can do about it.</p>	<p>While cost will never be a barrier, schools often provide honoraria <u>between \$150-400</u>. The program lasts approximately one hour and consists of a 30- to 40-minute presentation followed by a Q&A session (we can work with your time constraints).</p>
<p>HCP can host Field Trip groups of up to 40 students on Fridays mornings*. We can work with you to develop a bespoke program. A field trip can consist of a tour of our exhibit, a Generations Speaker, and other potential elements, such as a presentation on our CHUTZ-POW! comic book series, a talk on understanding antisemitism, or (if you've received a Butterfly Project grant) painting butterflies.</p>	<p><u>Cost varies</u></p> <p>Your budget could include funds to offset bus costs, a speaker honorarium, and an exhibit visit. If you are a LIGHT school, we can coordinate with the LIGHT Education Initiative for this field trip as well.</p> <p><i>*If your group is larger than 40 students or you need to visit on another day of the week, we can adjust with advance planning.</i></p>
